



Teaching “Coldwater Safety & Survival”



Teaching Cold Water Safety and Survival is being offered online through the University of Alaska Southeast (UAS).

It provides teachers and other youth educators with the information they need to teach children and young adults to play and work safely in and around cold water. Participants are taught using sample exercises from Alaska Marine Safety Education Association’s (AMSEA) extensive K-12 curriculum that includes cold-water safety and survival, small boat safety and survival, and land safety and survival. This course covers topics that focus on cold-water safety and survival in the first two volumes of the curriculum. The full four-volume curriculum is online for easy access, but it is recommended that students purchase volumes 1 and 2 for ease in navigating through the course. The curriculum is available for purchase from AMSEA.

Teaching Cold Water Safety and Survival is completed over a thirteen-week period beginning February 1st and ending May 4th. Students work asynchronously within the timeline of each topic.

Total cost of this professional level course (ED 593) is \$260.00 for two university credits. This includes a \$130.00 course fee paid directly to AMSEA and \$130.00 fee paid to UAS Sitka. To register, contact Mary Chambers at AMSEA, 907-747-3287 or coursecoord@amsea.org.
